Francesca Woodman

Francesca Woodman was an American photographer known primarily for her self-portraits. Her photographs often presented an unconventional representation of the body and experimented with motion blur, double exposures, and other technical means. Woodman's images were often blurred or fragmented, and she played with the idea of concealment and incompleteness. Through her artistic approach, Woodman created aesthetic tension and conveyed a sense of the fragility and vulnerability of the self.

Short Biography Sylvia Hinz:

Sylvia Hinz is an instrumentalist, conductor, lecturer, initiator. Founder of the ensembles XelmYa, Umbratono and others. Praised for her equally fierce and boldly dramatic performance style, Sylvia Hinz is one of the world's leading recorder players specialising in contemporary music and improvisation.

In addition to intensive sound research for the instrument recorder, Hinz breaks new ground in combining sound, electronics & video art and works interdisciplinary on the topic: #ArtAsActivism.

She works with numerous international composers such as Mathias Spahlinger (DE), Zeynep Gedizlioglu (TR), Jeanne Artemis (DE), Cat Hope (AU), Michele Abondano



(CO), Sarah Angliss (UK), Guadalupe Perales (MX). Hinz studied recorder at the Berlin University of the Arts with Gerd Lünenbürger, experimental music with Dieter Schnebel, chamber music with Nigel North, and ensemble conducting at the BAK Trossingen, curates & performs solo programmes & concerts with ensembles and orchestras, loves unusual instrumentations & collaborations with other arts, promotes international collaborations, undertakes concert tours worldwide, gives master classes & workshops.
